**Rollin' Oldies May Car (or truck) of the Month,
Neal and Kitty Hubbard's 1966 Ford F100 SWB**



Neal & Kitty purchased the Ford pickup from the original builder in Springfield, Oregon in July 2005 not long after moving to Albany from Corvallis. I didn't have any particular hobbies in this stage of my life, so this sounded like a good idea. I always liked nice cars and always wanted a fast one. I liked the big engine!

It has a 429 balanced and blue printed big block Ford engine. The valves are operated with a Crane cam, full roller lifters, and 3/8" push rods. The engine is capped off with Edelbrock aluminum heads, aluminum intake, 4 barrel carb, aluminum water pump, and Hedman headers. The 2 ½ inch exhaust has a wye built in, which has removable caps to run wide open.

The power to the wheels runs through the C-6 auto transmission which is chipped and on to the 8.8 373 posi rear end. The rear fenders are tubbed to squeeze in the wider tires. The leaf springs are gone and replaced with a 4 link coil over system with a 1" sway bar.

One of the first things we did was to have Smith Glass install a smoke cab rear window in 2006. The practical reason for doing this was to cut down the strength of the hot sun shining on my neck in the summer. And it worked!

The dash has a custom Haneline gage cluster and a Flaming River chrome steering column, which I installed in 2010. In 2013 I built and installed a custom center consul with a radio and cup holders. The bench seat upholstery, which I designed, was done by Premiere upholstery of Albany in 2015.

The short box bed is finished in aluminum diamond plate with a matching storage box.

Rollin' Oldies June Car of the Month, Ed and Dottie Anderson's 1954 Ford Crestline Victoria



The car was built in Indiana in June 1954 sold in Portland in July, later it was bought by a guy in California who had it for several years. Then I went down to California and purchased it and brought it back to Oregon in 2005. The car has a later model Y-block 312 cubic inch motor

with a three speed overdrive transmission, a 9 inch ford rear end, and gets consistently 21 miles per gallon. It has been lowered 2 inches all the way around with Lincoln front spindles and ford mustang disc brakes.

Historian's Corner with Dottie Anderson

2018 Honor Flight

I became involved with the South Willamette Valley Honor Flight as a result of the Spring Hill North Albany Car Show for which I have been responsible for the past 5 years.

After the first year of this car show, I was asked to take it over. I put together a team and we chose CASA of Albany (the Foster Child program) as our main benefactor where all our proceeds would be donated. Last year one of our members suggested we consider the Honor Flight program in Eugene as a recipient of our proceeds. We agreed and were able to have two members of that organization join our car show planning team. They happened to be the original founder and the current Director. The South Willamette Valley Honor Flight will receive all proceeds this year and all future years as long as I'm involved in this car show.

Last year we had our most successful car show thus far with 195 registered vehicles on the 10th fairway at Spring Hill Golf Club. At the check presentation at the Veteran's Home in Lebanon a week after the show, I was asked if I would like to be considered as a Guardian of a future Honor Flight. We had just presented them with a check for about \$ 6,600.00. I said YES and filled out the paperwork. A few months later I received word that I had been approved as a Guardian for the October, 2017 trip but had to decline, as we were going to be out of town. I was told that I would be then approved for the May 2018 trip.

On May 17, 2018 I went up to Portland to begin this adventure. I met my Veteran, who is 87 years old and lives on and works a 60 acre / 70 head of Polled Hereford beef small cattle ranch south of Eugene. We had talked three times on the phone before we actually met. We spent the night getting to know each other at the Shiloh Inn and flew to Reagan National in Washington, D.C. on Friday morning, May 18. We had a terrific time viewing the various memorials, museums and monuments in the nation's capital for two days. It was a very busy time. There were a total of 45 veteran's (13 WWII, 23 Korean War and 9 Viet Nam War) along with 45 Guardians like myself. In addition, we had another 16 people on the trip (medical personnel, Honor Flight personnel, volunteers and a T.V. crew from Eugene). Out of the 45 veterans, we had 36 wheelchairs on board the two tour buses but not all used them. The weather on Saturday was pretty lousy until after lunch and then improved. We spent two nights in The Hotel Westin at Dulles National Airport and flew back to Portland on Sunday afternoon, getting into Portland about 8:00 PM to a fantastic welcome at the airport. A bagpipe led group of about 40 uniformed

personnel at full attention and hundreds of spectators greeted the Veteran's as they disembarked the plane and were led to a ceremony in the baggage claim area of the airport before boarding busses to take them back to the Shiloh Inn prior to departing for home.

That was something that I, as well as the veterans, will never forget. I was home about 10:00 PM. I can honestly say that this was the biggest honor of my life to be able to go on this trip and help our War Heroes and Veterans so that they could see the memorials and monuments that have been built to honor them in their service to our country. I have volunteered to once again be a Guardian if needed.

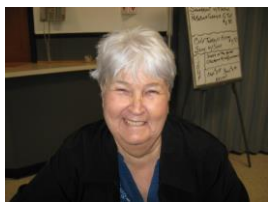

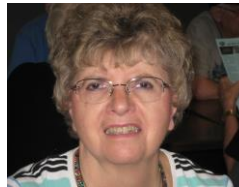

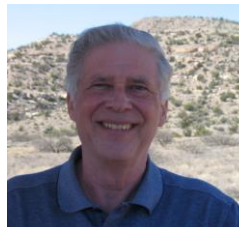
